Whether we take a few days off for a long weekend or multiple weeks so that we can get away from it all, each of us seem to look forward to the opportunities summer provides. Maybe it is because of the average school calendar in our

Be careful though. There are somethings that must always be close to us. As those who have chosen to "lose our lives" for Christ, we can never leave God behind. God expects each of His children to remain close to Him at all times. God has promised "never to leave or forsake" those who put their trust in His Word. With this in mind, consider a few things with me.

### **Is God with you when you plan your summer outings?**

When deciding where to travel on that summer vacation we ought to consider what God thinks about our plans. There are some very attractive destinations in our own country and across the world. Nature's beauty is evident in our parks and forests. Entertainment can be found at any number of theme parks. Water seems to be a very popular destination for summertime travels. One question for the Christian might be, "Will such a destination shine a light on my service to God or will it shine a light on my worldly desires?" Another, "Will I be in danger of enticement or desires leading to lust, or will this destination bring me closer to the Creator?"

When deciding how long you will be "away from it all" each Christian should keep in mind the obligations service to God entails. Opportunity to worship with those of like precious faith can be limited by lack of local congregations in many areas of this country, and this is even more true in

other areas of the world. Where will you be when it comes time to remember the sacrifice of our Savior with your brethren? Will you be able to "come together" to fellowship in this remembrance? Will your mode of travel allow for such fellowship with brethren?

When packing for your summer excursions we also need to keep God close in our thoughts. Sometimes when we think about getting away from it all we also look forward to getting away from the eyes of those who know us, and our weaknesses. If your suitcase was searched, would they find things that you would not want your brethren to know you wore? Would your Bible look out of place beside your vacation attire? Would it seem to the one looking into your bag that you loved God or the pleasures of the world?

No matter where you go, there God is! We might be able to find time to get away from our job for a short time, but God is always near. Once you decided to follow Jesus, you decided that He would always be with you. When Jesus said "Seek first His kingdom and His righteousness" he made no exception for vacations.

While Memorial day is especially for the remembering of those who died for our freedoms, we understand that we should remember such sacrifice always. The same is true, yet much more important, regarding our Lord and Savior. It is not sufficient to keep Him in mind on Sunday, we must keep Him in our mind, and in our plans, everyday and always.
