A famous philosopher, Karl Barth, had studied the Bible for years. On one occasion he was asked “What is the greatest theological discovery you have ever made?” His answer was simple, “Jesus loves me this I know, for the Bible tells me so.” These words are the first line of the song “Jesus Loves Me,” a song that is literally sung by children and adults all over the world. What a wonderful thing it would be if every man, woman and child in the world could come to this same understanding for it certainly carries a life changing message for a sin sick world.

*(This is His commandment, that we believe in the name of His Son Jesus Christ, and **love one another**, just as He commanded us. **1John 3:23**)*

Divinely inspired men during the first century, “*by word or epistle*” **2Thessalonians 2:15**, taught lost humanity that Jesus loved them. While proclaiming this love of Jesus orally they also wrote it down to be read by all future generations. Any person reading what inspired men wrote would have the same understanding of what they preached. Read **Ephesians 3:2-8**. If Jesus loves us, undeserving sinners, why can we not love one another?

*(and let us consider how to **stimulate one another to love and good deeds** **Hebrews 10:24**)*

We no longer have inspired men but we have their inspired book, the New Testament, to tell us “Jesus loves me, this I know, for the Bible tells me so.” As Karl Barth noted, the only way anyone can know of this great truth is through reading The New Testament. He has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of His love, in whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins*” **Colossians 1:12-14**. Thank God for the book that teaches us this.

*(For you were called to freedom, brethren; only do not turn your freedom into an opportunity for the flesh, but **through love serve one another**. **Galatians 5:13**)*

(As I read this article, the scriptures I have included between the paragraphs came to mind. We have spent some time in class talking about our need to be careful of developing an aggressive attitude. Too many in our society are ready to retaliate “at the drop of a hat.” We, as children of God, are to be of a different spirit.

Jesus calls for us to “love one another” and to “love our enemies.” We must not allow our minds to focus on getting revenge or restitution. Our focus must always be on serving God and helping those around us to find Him in His Word. We cannot do this if we are ‘getting even’ with others.

As long as our minds think in terms of the world we will struggle to love those who cause us difficulty. If we truly want to obey the command of God to “love
