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Woodpeckers hammer their beaks into trees at an astounding rate of 18-22 times per second. They hit the tree with a force of 1200g. If humans were to bang their heads into something with a chisel attached to their face it would certainly prove fatal. NFL players have been sidelined after being subjected to only 98g. Yet these incredible jackhammers of the sky survive unscathed and they have their special and specific design to thank for it.

A woodpecker's tail feathers and feet form a type of tripod that braces the woodpecker against the tree and helps distribute the energy from their pecking. The upper beak of the woodpecker has the ability to change its position just before the lower, and stronger, beak strikes the tree. This deflects almost all of the impact away from its brain. It also has a layer of cartilage between their beak and their skull. The room between their brain and their skulls is greatly reduced which would help prevent injury. Its brain is also broader at the front distributing the impact over a greater area.

In addition to these features, the woodpecker has a very long tongue that forks below its neck, goes around its jugular vein, and around its head. Scientists believe that when the woodpecker is hammering on a tree, its tongue compresses the vein and forces a layer of blood to fill the gap between its brain and skull providing an additional cushion. There is also a special attachment on their tongues called a hyloid layer which also reduces the vibrations. This tongue is not only specially designed to prevent shock, it is also perfectly designed for reaching and grabbing the bugs that live inside the trees. The

tongue of the woodpecker has a spear shaped head special barb like hairs that stick out backwards allowing it to stick and hold onto its prey (like fishing treble hooks).

The woodpecker has inspired engineers to imitate their incredible design. Some researchers copied the woodpecker and created a steel case filled glass beads and discovered these beads were protected up to 60,000g. In 2015, doctors created a collar for football players to wear which puts a little pressure on the jugular and providing a slight increase in blood around the brain thus creating a woodpecker-like cushion. Engineers have also looked to woodpeckers to design stronger and more efficient hammers.

The macro-evolutionist claims all of these complex systems and structures evolved over a long period of time through natural selection. This requires features which, at the time, are useless to stick around during evolution which evolutionists claim get eliminated in the process. Woodpeckers are also dependent on these features, as they appear, for their survival. How would a woodpecker survive without its ingeniously designed shock absorbing system? As Dr. Jason Lisle points out, "Natural selection does not explain why we find animals perfectly suited for their environment. All natural selection explains is why we do not find animals who are unsuited for their environment."

What natural selection and survival of the fittest fails to account for, the Bible offers a clear and reasonable explanation: Purposeful design from our almighty Creator. Woodpeckers are not the product of time and chance, but the creative and wise mind of
