This mystery is that the Gentiles are fellow heirs, members of the same body, and partakers of the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel.

Paul's message in the verse above is unity in Christ. Though he spent several years working with the brethren in and around Ephesus, there were still many who would not fully accept this unity. A major difficulty in the early church was understanding that all were saved in the same manner, no matter their heritage. None were saved by their own actions. All were saved by grace through faithful submission to Christ.

But Paul does not stop there. He continues in the latter half to encourage faithfulness, giving practical examples of their submission to one another in Christ. His final instruction is to stand firm together in the Word of God.

This period of thanksgiving is a reflection upon the many things of which our lives have been blessed. There are so many things to be thankful for and the expression of thanks is just as important as the object of our thanks. To be thankful is a heart that realizes the good things of life in concert with the more difficult parts we struggle with. The giving of thanks is not an absence of the problems faced in life but the grace by which we have been able to overcome them.

Peter expresses the value of true joy when he writes: "In this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while, if need be, you have been grieved by various trials, that the genuineness of your faith, being much more precious than gold that perishes, though it is tested by fire, may be found to praise, honor, and glory at the revelation of Jesus Christ." (**1Peter 1:6-7**) The purpose of trials is to bring about humility and understanding of our need for God. Without the challenges of life, we would not grasp the true meaning of being thankful. Through the test of fire, our faith is challenged to stand firm. Through our determined faith to be strong in the Lord, we realize much more to be thankful for. The grace of God means more. Jesus' sacrifice upon the cross grows in dimension to our thanksgiving for His death. Looking for the coming of the Son of God fills our hearts with the voice of gratitude for the hope of eternal life.

The true character of thanksgiving is to realize that where we are today was made possible by sacrifice. The early pilgrims were thankful after a very difficult year of suffering and the blessing of having what they had. Our country was made possible by the valiant sacrifice of the many that died to give us this freedom. Above all of these considerations, the joy of eternal life is made possible by the sacrifice of Jesus Christ.
