1Corinthians 14:33

How Were You Converted? Shawn Smith

Essential to entering the Lord's kingdom is being converted. Jesus told His disciples, "Unless you are converted and become as little children, you will by no means enter the kingdom of heaven" (Matthew 18:3). To be converted is to change or turn from one form to another. The word picture in the Greek language is that of turning around in a road and facing the other way. Becoming like a little child means we become humble; we do not desire power or authority; we don't make outward distinctions between others; we are free of ambition, pride, malice, and haughtiness; we are teachable; we are totally dependent upon God, and most obvious of all, we must be innocent and clear of wrongdoing. Jesus told Nicodemus he must be, "born anew" (John 3:3,5).

We don't have to wonder what the seed for this new birth is: It is God's word (Luke 8:11). Peter says of this seed that it is incorruptible and eternal in its nature (1Peter 1:22-23) and that we are begotten again by the gospel, God's word. Paul declares that he had begotten the Corinthians through the gospel (1Corinthians 4:15). Now here's the rub: We learn from the book of Romans that our delivery in this new birth takes place when we are baptized into Christ (Romans 6:3-5). Put another way, "For you are all sons (children) of God through faith in Christ Jesus. For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ" (Galatians 3:26-27). Have you been truly converted according to the New Testament or not?

(Another question we might ask, "To what were you converted?" The Word of God will convert one to Him, but there are those who have been converted to a group of people rather than to God. There is no salvation in a group of people or 'church', Only by conversion to Christ's Gospel can we be saved from sin. DLH)
