- 3. Who could sin ignorantly? 4:3,13,22,27,28. What does 5:17 mean? anointed priest, all Israel, ruler, common people; guilty of sin done without knowledge
- 4. What is said about the fire on the altar? 6:12-13. List the three types of peace offerings. 7:11-12,16 shall not go out; thanksgiving, vow, freewill
- 5. Who offered these offerings for the people? 8:1-5 (see Ex. 40:12-15). In chapter 9 the service of the tabernacle is actually begun. As Moses and Aaron blessed the people, what happened? 9:23-24

 Aaron & his sons; fire consumed burnt offering
- 6. Then what happened? 10:1-3; 16:12. Name Aaron's other sons. 10:12 Nadab & Abihu offered strange fire, Eleazar & Ithamar
- 7. Lev. 16 deals with the Day of Atonement, read it carefully and be ready for a brief discussion
- 8. What is said about blood? 17:10-12. Who could not be a priest? 21:16-24 *life is in the blood; blemished blind, lame, etc*
- 9. List their special days. 23:3,4-6,10-16,23-25,26-28,34-36,37-38 weekly sabbath, passover, unleavened bread, firstfruits, trumpets, atonement, tabernacles
- 10. List some things for which death was penalty. 24:10-23. What special years did they observe? 25:1-7,8-17 blasphemy-cursing, murderer; sabbath year, jubilee
- 11. What charge was given in 26:1-2? Note the blessings and curses. 26:3-46. When they tithed, how much did they give to the Lord? 27:32
 - no idols, keep sabbaths, reverence sanctuary; 1/10th of all
- 12. Lessons For Today:
- A. What was the work of the high priest (Aaron)? What was the work of the priests (Aaron's sons)? What made atonement for sin? 17:11; Heb. 9:22
 - offer atonement in holy of holies; offer sacrifices; blood
- B. Who is our high priest? Heb. 7:11-19. What has he done for us? Heb. 9:22-28 *Jesus; shed his blood*
- C. Who are priests now? 1Pet 2:5,9. List sacrifices they make. Heb.13:15-16 Christians; give life to serve God, give time, money, talent
- D. Offerings had to be without what? Lev. 1:3. Is it possible to offer blemished offerings to God today? If so, how? Matt. 15:8-13
 - blemish; yes; give what is left over; worship with minds on world
- E. How did God react to their offerings? Lev. 9:23-24; 10:1-2. In what ways might God react to our offerings today?
 - devoured righteous offerings; destroyed those who offered wrongly
- F. They could sin ignorantly. Can we? How can we prevent sins of ignorance? *yes, study, constantly watch self, listen to others*

 - drink of grape, cut hair, come near dead body; passover if unclean; cut off from people
- 4. What journey did the Israelites make? 10:11-13. What happened in 11:10-17? to wilderness of Paran; Moses burden shared among seventy elders
- 5. Who spoke against Moses? 12:1-11. What was done next? 13:1-2 *Miriam & Aaron; spies sent to Canaan*

- 9. Whose rod budded? Why? 17:1-8. For what were the ashes of a red heifer used? 19:1-10 *Aaron's was God's chosen; water for impurity; a sin offering*
- 10. Who died? 20:1,28. What sin did Moses and Aaron commit? 20:7-12 *Miriam; did not sanctify God before Israel exalted self*
- 11. Why did Moses put a brazen serpent on a pole? 21:8-9. What Amorite king was defeated? 21:21-24. Who wanted to settle east of the Jordan? 32:32-33 cure serpent's bite; Sihon; Gad, Ruben, half of Manasseh
- 12. Note: Deuteronomy consists of three speeches given by Moses. We will notice the following passages: 5:1-4; 28:1-68; 34:1-12
- 13. Lessons For Today:
- A. What happened if a person neglected the Passover? 9:13. What about the person who neglects the services of the Lord? Jas. 4:17 cutoff; cutoff
 - Therefore, to one who knows the right thing to do and does not do it, to him it is sin. Jas 4:17
- B. What attitude did some of the spies have? 13:33; 14:44. What attitude should God's people have? Rom. 8:31,37; Phil. 4:13
 - we are alone and cannot win; God is with us and we can triumph
- C. What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who is against us? ... But in all these things we overwhelmingly conquer through Him who loved us. Rom 8:31,37

- D. Moses brought forth water, but was God pleased? 20:7-12. Then, does the end justify the means? no; no
- E. Read John 3:14-16. How does the incident in the wilderness help you understand John 3:16?
