(Speak on passover - Just enough for each house, none left over, NO Leaven, No Yeast -  
Unleavened bread & Juice/Non-alcoholic)

**A Reminder**

***1Corinthians 11:23-25***

Not for passing thoughts, a time for focus, sorrow in the garden, betrayal, trial, humiliation,  
rejection, sacrifice

Remember the signs and acknowledgments at His death

All because of my sins.

**A Proclamation**

***1Corinthians 11:26***

Not just a memory, an opportunity to show others

Our regular observance speaks of His death, our belief

It tells others we believe He is the only way - **John 14:6-7**

**A Communion**

***1Corinthians 10:16-17***

Through this memorial we are drawn to Christ and to one another.

In this memorial we emphasize our unity with Christ & brethren

This worship both personal and communal and a part of our wonderful fellowship with one another  
and God

**A Hope**

In the Supper we proclaim Christ's death till He returns

***1Corinthians 11:26; 1Thessalonians 4:16; Hebrews 9:28; 1Corinthians 15:51-53***

His death, burial, & resurrection is our assurance that He will return - **Acts 17:30-31**

**A Refreshing**

Reflection & Renewal

Sacrifice encourages greater attention to my service

Return impress me with need to be prepared

Corinthian's failure to consider left them sick and dying - **1Corinthians 11:30**

We will suffer as well if we are undiscerning

**Consider This Memorial**
