Remember Your Creator Demands **Knowing Your Creator**

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revealed by God in His Divine Word: "*Remember also* thy Creator in the days of thy youth, before the evil days come, and the years draw nigh, when thou shall say, I have no pleasure in them" (Ecclesiastes 12:1).

The command to remember the Creator is not new with Solomon. The Lord exhorted Israel to remember Him with penalty of forgetting Him (**Deuteronomy 8**). "But the loving-kindness of Jehovah is from everlasting to everlasting upon them that fear him, and his righteousness unto children's children; to such as keep his covenant, and to those that remember his precepts to do them" (**Psalms 103:17-18**). Being careful to remember the Lord was to hedge one's mind about with His commandments, judgments, and statutes (**Deuteronomy 8:11**).

The challenge for youth today is far more complex that remembering the Creator - they have to learn who He is! Remembering the Creator suggests a mind that knows something to remember. Our young people are struggling with knowledge of the Creator because many homes do not instill in their children knowledge of God. They will know who the winners of American Idol are; the names of every player on the National Champions of basketball and football; the words to music that is supposed to be music; and the cell phone numbers to fifty friends - but have little or no knowledge of who I AM THAT I AM (**Exodus 3:14**).

Our youth are fighting against the pressures of the world without a proper defense in the knowledge of GOD ALMIGHTY (**Genesis 17:1**). Knowing who the Creator is will give our youth a sense of strength and

This verse continues the thought of our last passage. The Word that created all things became as His creation. He was still one with the Father even while walking among men on Earth.

courage filled with hope. To know the ALMIGHTY will give assurance to our youth they were made in His image (**Genesis 1:26**); not a monkey. Understanding the HEAVENLY FATHER will help our youth find peace in a world of chaos as He gives understanding through HIS WORD (**Psalm 119**). Believing in GOD will help them find the SON OF GOD. How can our youth believe in a SON when they do not know the FATHER (**John 14:6-11**)?

Parents who fail to teach their children about GOD prepare their children for heartache, misery, destitution and failure. The LORD commanded the Israelite parents to teach their children about HIM "that they may set their hope in God, and not forget the works of God" (Psalm 78:7). PARENTS - Read DEUTERONOMY 6 and PSALM 78! Many children (not all) whose spirit is not faithful to God can blame their parents for that failure. They could not remember what they were never taught! What are we teaching our children?

(While this article is focused on helping the young get to know God, we must never forget that there are hundreds in our community who have a misunderstanding of God also. Before we can convince the lost of their need to submit to God's commands, we must help them understand who God is and what He has done. Remember **Hebrews 11:6** *"And without faith it is impossible to please Him, for he who comes to God must believe that He is and that He is a rewarder of those who seek Him."* We must teach God to others or they will be lost for all eternity!)
