Kappa Delta Pi is an international honor society in education. This society publishes the Kappa Delta Pi RECORD. In the magazine for the Spring of 1987, Jean Cain, a teacher in the Memphis City Schools, had a perceptive article. teaching today." After citing a host of ever increasing impediments to teaching, this dedicated teacher said as per the title of her article, "I'm teaching as fast as I can" to overcome the difficulties.

A Picture of Our Society

One of the most pernicious and pervasive problems teachers have to cope with is the demand "for teachers to solve the problems that a morally lenient society has created." Please read with me her professional appraisal of societal morals and their implications for teaching. She wrote the following as a paragraph but I am going to number the points she made for our convenience.

1. "Society produces movies, songs, and television programs where smoking marijuana and sniffing cocaine are commonplace and acceptable,
2. where everyone has a smart come-back to every statement or question,
3. where authority is ridiculed,
4. where moral standards no longer exist,
5. where the quick thrill is sought,
6. where long-term goals are obsolete,
7. where greed is a common motivating factor,
8. and where power is synonymous with success."

These societal conditions have significant ramifications for the work of teaching. The author contended that "These movies, songs, and programs depict heroes who display no regard for life or property. Yet, we teachers are expected to be miracle workers and reach each and every child who passes through our classrooms combatting all this erotic stimuli with reading, writing, and arithmetic. I'm

We Can Live Above The World

While songs with immoral connotations fill the air waves, we need to sing the songs of Zion as the Lord's antidote. In a society where moral standards no longer exist we must hold up the word of God as absolute truth and hold to it as our standard. Where the quick thrill is sought by the majority and long-term goals seem obsolete, we must tell people what lies beyond the grave just as fast as we can. Where greed is the motivating factor in our society we must teach the grace of giving and remember that it is more blessed to give than to receive. To those who view power as synonymous with success we must, as fast as we can, teach the greatness in the kingdom of God that is accomplished by being servant of all.

While we live in the world, we are not to be of the world. In a world that imbibes the hemlock of existentialism, situation ethics and amorality, let us learn that it is *"Through thy precepts I get understanding: Therefore I hate every false way."* **Psalm 119:104**. Let us pray for strength as we live in this morally lenient society and with full assurance of faith be content to preach the word and practice the same leaving the results with Him who has prepared
