Yet these words should give us comfort, strength, and hope.

Jesus has provided a sure and certain path for those who submit to God through His death, burial, and resurrection. When we place our trust in God and the Word He has left to guide us we can be certain of our path to His dwelling place. God did not send His Son to die, and His Word to guide so that we would be worried and concerned about our eternal destiny. What God has given brings us assurance and certainty in the midst of a life full of uncertainty and difficulty. Our responsibility is to simply submit to His Will and let Him guide us. We need to do this while we can so that when we are no longer able to serve due to a lack of strength in our body, we will know that we have done our best for Him. The preacher reminds us of this need in **Ecclesiastes 12:6-7**:

"Remember Him before the silver cord is broken and the golden bowl is crushed, the pitcher by the well is shattered and the wheel at the cistern is crushed; then the dust will return to the earth as it was, and the spirit will return to God who gave it."

Let us always keep God foremost in our heart and mind so that we can enjoy the blessings and guidance that have been assured to those who are His children. "Draw near to God and He will draw near to you." (James 4:8)
