He Gets Us, But Do We Get Him? Max Dawson

I have not seen or watched any of those ads, but have heard a number of brethren comment about them, both positively and negatively. What I have heard indicates they are mostly about love and acceptance, which are much needed, but they seem to be lacking in instruction about submission and obedience. Whenever these ideas are promoted separately rather than together, there is usually an agenda at work and we need to be careful with such teaching, no matter who originates it. DLH)

Today's blog is prompted by an incident at a NASCAR race this past Saturday. It was a race in the Xfinity series at Michigan International Speedway. There was an on-track incident involving two cars from the Joe Gibbs team. The number 20 car driven by John Hunter Nemechek bumped the number 19 car driven by Ty Gibbs (Joe Gibb's grandson). Both cars spun down the track; neither car was damaged. Nemechek went on to win the race.

Things like this happen in racing all the time. But their was something unique about this case--and it wasn't just the fact that the two drivers were teammates. Rather, it was that Ty Gibbs strongly criticized his teammate over the team radio. The words he used could not be repeated by the pit reporter who heard it. She just said, "Ty Gibbs had some 'choice words' for his teammate." While we don't know the words used, we know what was meant by that.

And while it is not uncommon for race drivers to say things that can't go out over the TV broadcast, there was something even more unique about this case. Ty Gibbs' car was sponsored by "He Gets Us." Those three words were in big letters on the hood of his car.

"He Gets Us" is the name of a national ad campaign about Jesus. You may have seen some of the ads on TV. The videos are readily available online. They present Jesus as a rebel, a refugee, and an immigrant, as well as other portrayals. You might not find all the videos to your liking, but the message is one of peace, love, and brotherhood. "He Gets Us" attempts to present Jesus in a contemporary way that is designed to grab your attention.

"He Gets Us" was blazoned all over the number 19 car driven by Gibbs. I wondered what people thought about Jesus when they heard Gibbs had used "choice words" about his teammate. Somehow, the message of peace, love and brotherhood was lost there.

The lesson for us is very simple. If we profess to follow Jesus, we have to watch our words because the world is watching us. The world loves to find hypocrisy in those who profess to follow Jesus. We are to *"let our light so shine before men that they may see our good works and glorify our Father in heaven"* (Matthew 5:16).


