You know, Three Stooges, Bugs Bunny, Wylie Coyote, etc. Grandchildren are a great excuse to break out some of those old cartoons and comedies I remember and love from my childhood. Every kid needs to at least be exposed to good quality cartoons. Besides, have you seen the junk they pawn off as cartoons now-a-days? But I diverge from my path. By the way, the parents are well aware of what we let their children watch.

One of the shows I enjoy watching is an old classic from the 'just as color was getting started' era, Gilligan's Island. You remember the plot. The tale of fateful ship. The Skipper and Gilligan, his fearless crew, take on five passengers for a three-hour tour from Hawaii. The rough weather caused them to be shipwrecked on an uncharted island. For three years, and decades of reruns, we watched as they tried vainly to get off that island with no success. About now some of you are thinking, "what does this have to do with God," aren't you?

I think the problem of those "seven stranded castaways" is very similar to one of our problems today.

The big difference is direction. They wanted to get off the island. We want others to join us on our island. What???? Bear with me a moment.

As Christians we are part of an island of calm in the midst of the stormy sea of this world. The Church that belongs to Christ is a place of stability and structure. We know that God is with us and that He will help us navigate the cares and struggles here on Earth as long as we submit ourselves to the plan He has provided. Through Christ we know peace.

John 16:33 I have said these things to you, that in me you may have peace. In the world you will have tribulation. But take heart; I have overcome the world.

Philippians 4:5-7 Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand; do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Our friends and neighbors are trying to find their place in this world. They thrash about trying to discover the secret to happiness and fulfillment. Some of them have a small measure of direction, but most are wandering around following blind leaders into utter desolation. The few who have begun to know a little about God find some measure of hope for peace but do not have the full release of no guilt that we have found in Christ.

Maybe we need to start thinking a little more like those 'castaways' and see the urgency of the situation. The people in our lives need what we have found. If we don't communicate with the folks in the world around us, most of them will never find their way to the peace that is found only in Christ.
