One Way To Heaven Max Dawson

Acts chapter four is about the courage of the Lord's apostles as they stood for the truth about Jesus. The chapter opens with the Jewish sect of the Sadducees being disturbed over the preaching of the apostles. They proclaimed that Jesus was raised from the dead. Since the Sadducees did not believe in resurrection they were upset by the apostles' preaching.

At the same time, we notice that the number of the disciples has grown to be about 5,000 men (**Acts 4:4**). The fact that so many Jews were going over to Jesus was further upsetting to the Jewish leaders. They arrested the apostles (Peter and John) and called them to give account for their preaching and for the healing of the lame man in chapter three.

They wanted to know, "By what power or by what name have you done this?" (Acts 4:7). Peter gave a Holy Spirit inspired answer. "Let it be known to you all, and to all the people Israel, that by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified, whom God raised from the dead, by Him this man stands before you whole" (Acts 4:10). The Jewish leaders had the power to punish Peter and John, yet the apostles stood firm on their testimony.

God's men went even further in proclaiming Jesus to be the *"rejected stone,"* thus fulfilling the prophetic word of **Psalm 118:22**. And then, they proclaimed what is the primary thought of today's offering, *"Nor is there salvation in any other, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved"* (Acts 4:12).

The Jewish leaders must have been dumbfounded by this claim, just as many people today find it shocking. Can it be true

that there is only one way to heaven? Indeed, it is true. Jesus Himself personally made the same declaration in **John 14:6**, *"I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father but by me." "No one...,"* said Jesus. *"No other name..."* said Peter. There is no mistaking what the Bible says. Jesus is the only way!

Yet this truth is not palatable to most people. Celebs like Steve Harvey and Oprah Winfrey are famous for saying things like, "There cannot possibly be just one way." Some folks give Oprah a pass, thinking she has been misunderstood. Please Google "Oprah one way" to get the truth on that. Modern Americans are much quicker to listen to Oprah or Steve than they are to listen to Jesus or Peter. The reason is obvious. "Many ways" makes no demand on me!

Jesus is the Messiah, the Christ, the one prophesied in the Old Testament, the one who died for our sins and was raised from the dead for our justification. No one else! Only Jesus. That teaching is offensive to a world that does not want to serve God. The world does not want to hear it--and even much of so-called "Christendom" does not accept it.

One of the marks of a Kingdom Leader is that he accepts whatever Jesus said. Jesus is the only one who ever came down from heaven; we must believe Him. Faced with the threat of punishment, the two apostles--Peter and John--courageously spoke the truth. They stood where Kingdom Leaders today must stand.

Do not waver. Do not compromise. Be firm. Speak as the Bible speaks. I hope you have the conviction to do so. Tragically, many do not.
