Spectator

Always look on - does nothing to help; I "can't " - Sing, pray, teach, visit

Use talents (opportunities) we have according to abilities Matthew 25:14-30

I must do: Ephesians 4:16; John 4:35; James 4:17

I can do: Philippians 4:13; 1Corinthians 15:58

Hesitator

Always planning - thinking about doing

I intend to some day: Give up worldliness, bad language bad habits; Obey Gospel, attend regularly, be more diligent in study, visiting, give more.

It is good to plan but planning must be carried out - John 9:4; James 2:21-26

Imitator

Copies others, follows the crowd; No convictions, just goes along - **Ephesians 4:14; Exodus 23:2; Proverbs 1:10**

Have faith to stand alone if necessary - Hebrews 11:6-8,24; Ephesians 6:11-14; Philippians 1:14-17

Commentator

Gives advice on how to do or criticizes the way something is being done

Fault - finder - mote hunter - Matthew 23:3-4

Do as I say and not as I do - Romans 2:19-21

Mote hunting - Matthew 7:3-5; Romans 3:23

We have obligation to point out error, but we are to be busy working ourselves as well, not just watching others

Agitator

Trouble maker - never satisfied unless problems exist.

Whispering, Backbiting, Tattling, Busybody; One who blackens names & characters of others - yet always innocent - never does any wrong. - James 3:1-8

Should seek peace - 1Peter 3:11; Ephesians 4:3; Psalm 133:1

Mark them and avoid them - Romans 16:17-18; Proverbs 6:16-19

Dictator

Rule or Ruin - 3John 9-11

Humility makes one great in kingdom of heaven - **Matthew 18:1-4; 20:26-28; 1Corinthians 13:4-6** Be careful of importance we place on ourselves - **Romans 12:3**

Even Overseers can't be "Lords" over God's heritage - 1Peter 5:1-3
